



🔀 Rhodes Old City Tour

Interests: history, archaeology, architecture, culture

Discover the historic Rhodes Old Town at your own pace with a driver and a private guide at your disposal. Enter the town through one of the 7 gates located in the town's surrounding medieval walls and your local guide will share an intriguing glimpse into the significant influence the Ottomans, Knights of St John, Byzantines, Hellenistic and Romans had over the town through the ages. You will have the opportunity to stroll through the narrow streets before visiting the Grand Masters Palace. Originally built in the late 7th century, it boasts many incredible artifacts, ancient sculptures and beautiful 1st-century floor mosaics brought over from the island of Kos. Follow the footsteps of St John's knights along the completely restored "Street of Knights", past a number of medieval inns towards the former Knights Hospital which is now an archaeological museum that houses numerous archaeological treasures. Other places of interest are the Turkish Baths on Platia Arionos and Orffeos street, a bustling avenue with tourist stores, cafes, and restaurants near St Anthony's gate.

🗴 Tour of Lindos

Interests: history, archaeology, architecture, culture

Explore Lindos at your own pace with a car and private guide at your disposal. Step back in time and receive fascinating insights into the significant influence the Ottomans, St John's Knights, Byzantines, Hellenistic and Romans had over Lindos. Follow your local guide for a leisurely stroll through the charming narrow streets before ascending towards the ancient Acropolis. On your way up, you will see the renowned relief of a shipping vessel raised into a rock. Upon reaching the site, apart from reveling in the magnificent panoramic views, you will also explore the Doric Temple of Athena dating back to approximately 300 BC, the medieval Gothic church and fortress of St John's



Knights which was once used as the governor's quarters. Other noteworthy ruins on the site are the Propylaea of the Sanctuary, a monumental gateway, dating from the 4th century BC and the Hellenistic Stoa with lateral projecting wings, dating from about 200 BC.

Medieval Rhodes and the Jewish Quarter Interests: history, archaeology, architecture, culture

This exclusive half-day tour will introduce you to the fascinating Jewish heritage of Rhodes Old Town, before taking you back in time all the way to the island's medieval origins. You will start your discovery with a stroll through La Juderia, the Jewish Quarter. Along the way, you'll visit notable Jewish landmarks including Alhadeff Park and Alhadeff Street, named after a prominent Jewish family, the Square of the Martyred Jews and its seahorse fountain, and the Holocaust Memorial. You'll also visit the Kahal Kadosh Synagogue, the oldest synagogue in Greece, and the Jewish Museum of Rhodes. Your tour will continue with a fascinating insight into the medieval life on the island as your guide describes the battles and sieges fought by the Knights of St. John and how they shaped the town you see today. You'll explore medieval monuments and walk along the famous Street of the Knights, the best-preserved medieval street in Europe. Your tour will conclude at the 14th century Palace of the Grand Master, once home to the leader of the Knights of St. John of Rhodes. Today it's a museum housing medieval furniture, elaborate mosaics, and archaeological exhibits from Rhodes.

Medieval Walking Tour and Wine Tasting in Rhodes Interests: history, wine, foodie, archaeology, architecture, culture

Magnificent medieval monuments, a beautifully preserved old town, and a private wine tasting. This tour is perfect for wine lovers and history buffs who want to immerse themselves in the medieval history of Rhodes. The tour will start by introducing you to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Rhodes. The Old Town is like a medieval time capsule, transporting visitors back to the era of the Knights of St. John. Your professional English-speaking guide will lead you on a tour through the atmospheric, winding streets, pointing out medieval monuments and describing how the battles and sieges faced by the Hospitaller Knights shaped the town. The walking tour concludes at the Palace of the Grand Masters, a 14th century fortified castle that was restored in the 1930s. Once you've finished exploring the Palace, you'll wander down the famous Street of the Knights, the best-preserved medieval street in Europe. Your last stop of the tour will be the Inn of Auvergne, build in 1507, where you will have an amazing wine tasting experience along with some traditional Greek "meze".

Medieval Town Walking Food Experience Interests: foodie, history, wine, culture

Get a taste of the local life in this culinary journey through the flavors of Rhodes in Medieval Town. This tour is an amazing combination for those who want to experience the history but also the culture of the island. Rhodes island, due to its strategic position, has been a point of interest for colonizers and invaders for centuries and this has led to an intercultural exchange in many aspects



such as the local dialect and the food. Your English-speaking professional guide will take you through Medieval Town, share knowledge about the town's history while you try some of the local delicacies. You will visit different shops and try different flavors, from local pies, meze to liqueur drinks.

× Tales of Four Religions

Interests: history, archaeology, mythology

Rhodes, the cosmopolitan island of Helios (Sun) and the Hospitaller Knights, is filled with monuments that belong to different cultures and religions. During this walking tour, you will learn the history of the city and the island through its religious monuments. The tour will start from the Gate D' Amboise with an introduction to the town's history. Walking outside the Palace of the Grand Master and down the Street of the Knights, the first monument you will visit is the church of Our Lady of the Castle (currently the Byzantine Museum of Rhodes), a Byzantine church that has been standing for over 1000 years. You will then stop at the ancient temple of goddess Venus (Aphrodite), dating from the Hellenistic period, a symbol of pagan religion. In the heart of the medieval town, you will then visit the mosque of Ibrahim Pasha from the 16th century where aspects of Muslim religion and life in the Ottoman period will be illustrated. Last, you will visit the Kahal Shalom Synagogue, also built in the 16th century, and the Jewish Museum, giving you an insight into the island's Jewish heritage.

Filerimos, Valley of Butterflies and Panoramic City Tour Interests: nature, outdoor activities, history, mythology

During this exciting panoramic tour, you will have the opportunity to discover the highlights of ancient and modern-day Rhodes city before exploring its natural riches and historical site of Fileremos. After meeting your driver, you will start your scenic drive passing by the Mandraki Esplanade and the government buildings, the Church of Annunciation built 1925, a replica of the Old Church of the Knights of St John, and the deer statues at the entrance of Mandraki port. You will then continue up to Monte Smith for panoramic views and photo opportunities of Rhodes and the Aegean Sea. Your next destination will be the unique nature reserve "Butterfly Valley". Apart from its aesthetic value, it is also the site of the only natural forest of Liquidambar orientalis (Oriental Sweetgum trees) in Europe, and a resting point for the Jersey tiger a nocturnal moth. An excellent place for quests who wish to enjoy the beauties of nature and examine the life cycle of butterflies as part of their holiday. You will love the peaceful walk through the shaded, green valley with its small river and beautiful waterfalls. Permanently surrounded by butterflies camouflaging themselves against the tree trunks as you walk up towards the monastery at the top, or rest for a while on one of the wooden benches along the way. You will then proceed to Fileremos, the acropolis of the ancient city of Jalysos where you will embark on a guided tour of the ancient ruins of the temple of Athena and the impressive medieval monastery of the Virgin Mary. The ancient monuments, the spectacular panoramic view of the northern part of the island through the pine forest, and Venetian buildings will make this visit unforgettable.
